- The design features the archipelago seascapes viewed from Mt. Shiude located on the Shonai Peninsula in Kagawa Prefecture, together with the whirlpool of the Naruto Strait and a Japanese horseshoe crab.

Cape Sata, Field Crabapple, and Amanosakahoko



- The design features Cape Sata located at the southernmost point of mainland Kyushu (Kinkowan Bay area), and Field Crabapple, a wild species of trees found nowhere else in the world but Mt. Kirishima, and Amanosakahoko, a spear-like monument erected upside down on the crest of Mt. Takachiho (Kirishima area).
