- (Note 2) The latent images are different for the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020 1,000-yen commemorative silver coin and the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games 1,000-yen commemorative silver coin. See the Attachments (References 1 to 3 and 9) for details.
- (Note 3) Regarding the helical ridges on the edges of the 100-yen clad coins, while the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games commemorative coin has wide-spaced ridges, the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020 has narrow-spaced ridges so that they can be distinguished also by touching their edges.
- (Note 4) The 100-yen clad coins are circulated by being exchanged at their face value over the counter at financial institutions.
