Nachino-Otaki Falls, Odaigahara salamander, and Japanese
mountain cherry



- The design features Nachino-Otaki Falls, the tallest waterfall in Japan, with a height of 133 m, together with an Odaigahara salamander (*Hynobius boulengeri*) and Japanese mountain cherry (*Prunus jamasakura*).
